- Provided weekly individual psychotherapy to a caseload of 10+ clients with a wide range of co-occurring disorders in outpatient methadone maintenance treatment.
- Assisted clients in managing emergent issues by conducting regular safety assessments and implementing crisis intervention as needed.
- Coordinated with a multidisciplinary team made up of medical doctors, nurse practitioners, psychologists, and other health care providers.

- Composed treatment plans and progress notes that met MediCal, county, state, federal, and CARF standards, participated in an ongoing peer review process, and developed case presentations for the clinical staff.
- Received weekly didactic trainings focused on psychological issues and practice with dual-diagnosis populations.

HealthRight360-Bridges Outpatient Program – Trainee September 2014 – June 2015

- Conducted individual and group therapy with program participants on parole or probation in a harm-reduction milieu setting, where clients present with dual diagnosis (poly-substance use) and acute psychopathology
- Created and co-facilitated brief psychoeducational and process-oriented groups that focused upon substance abuse, resiliency development, decision making, anger management, and sexuality.
- Conducted informal and formal assessments (e.g. WAIS, MMPI-II) to guide treatment and evaluation of clients.
- Charted client progress through electronic health record systems
- Participated in weekly didactic training to develop skills in motivational interviewing, trauma informed care, and provided care for clients with acute presentations of mood and personality disorders.

Solano County Jail Counseling Program - Trainee September 2013 – June 2014

- Conducted therapy with individuals from diverse cultural backgrounds, presenting with complex psychological disorders such as PTSD, bipolar disorder and schizophrenia
- Sessions varied but focused on interpersonal relatedness, problem solving skills, coping techniques, emotion regulation, interpersonal effectiveness, impulse control, distress tolerance, transition from jail to prison, and social integration.
- Consistently held a case load of 5 individual clients ages 18-70 years old
- Consulted regularly with the Mental health Team regarding client medication and mental health status.
